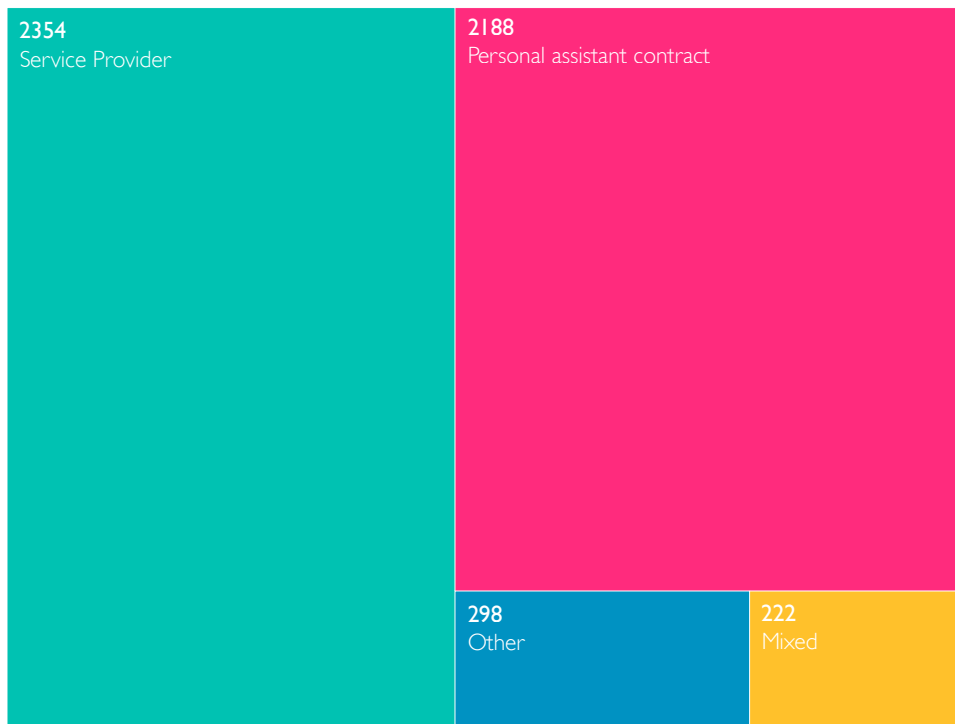

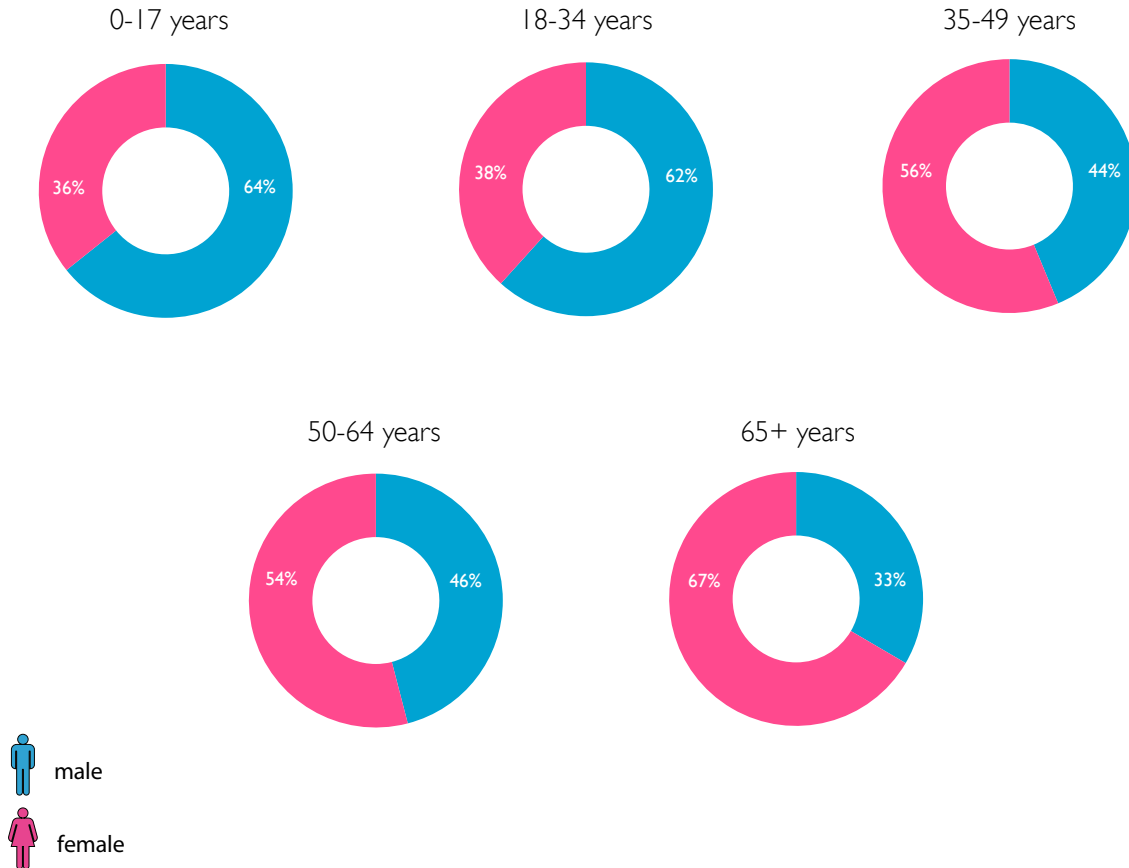
How direct payments were spent in Scotland, 2011-2012

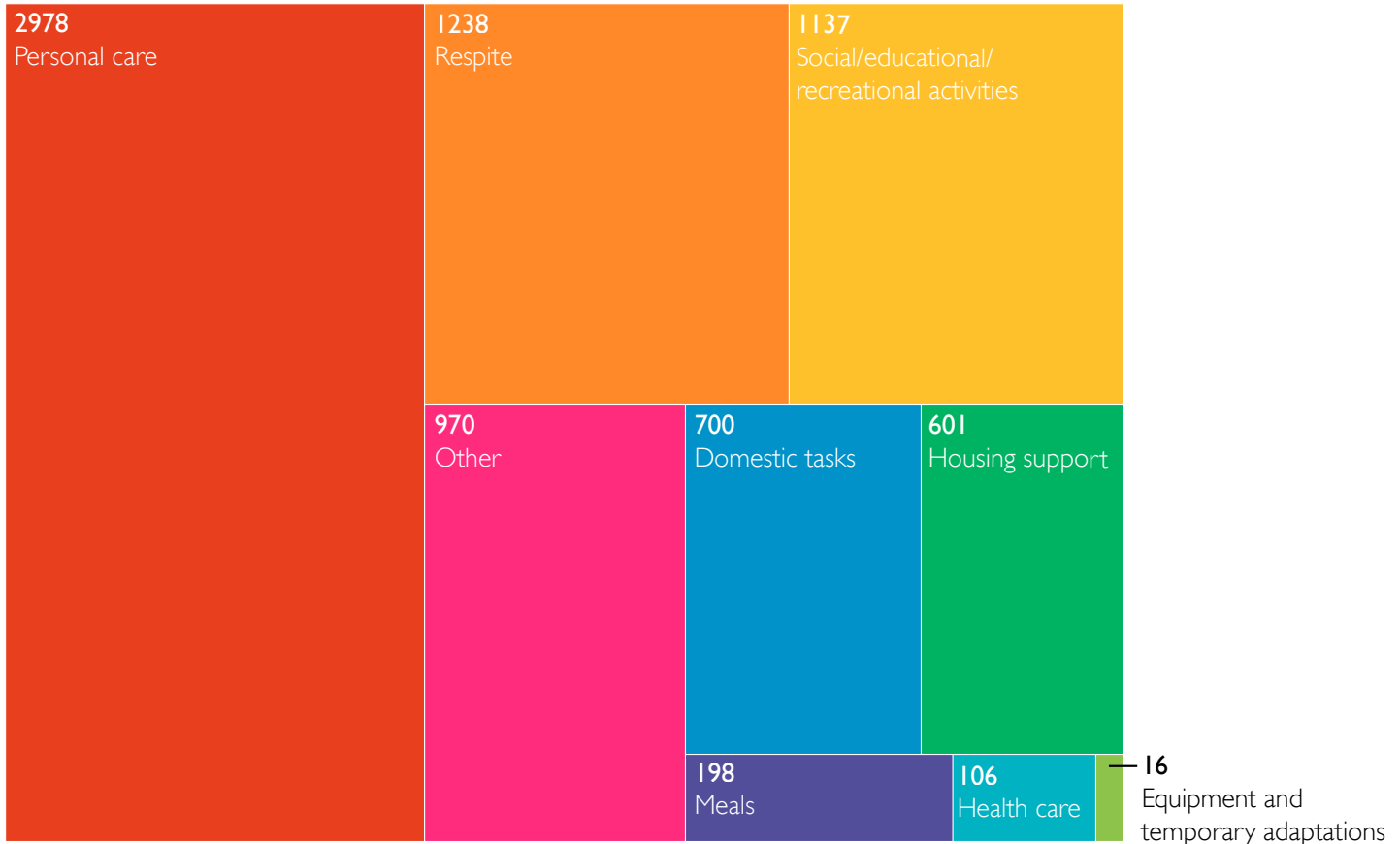
Age and gender of people receiving direct payment packages, 2011-12



Each doughnut chart represents an age group, and the blue and pink segments within indicate the distribution of men and women respectively. Overall the gender breakdown of people receiving direct payment packages is 53% women and 47% men.

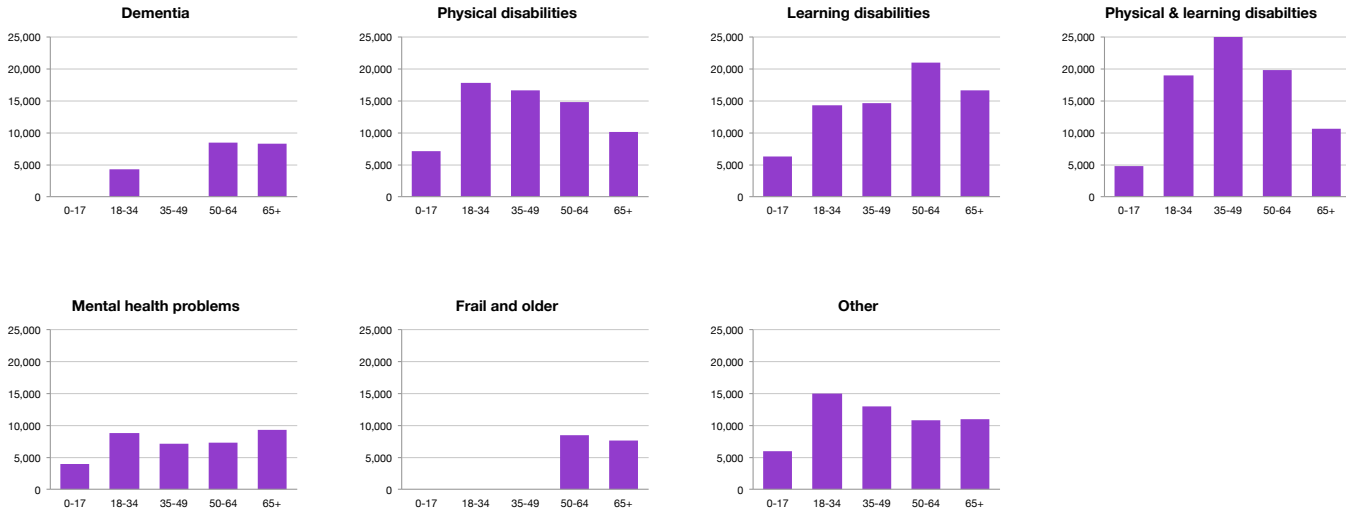
What direct payments were spent on in Scotland, 2011-12

This group of column charts shows the average (mean) value of direct payments per person per year, by client groups and age groups. The total number of people in Scotland receiving a direct payment in 2012 was 5049.
